Prerequisites for 3000 level and 4000 level business courses, in addition to course specific prerequisites, are as follows: 54 earned hours for 3000 level business courses and 84 earned hours and a minimum grade of "C" in any Writing in the Discipline (WID) course for 4000 level business courses.

A minimum overall GPA of 2.0 is required for the courses included in the minor.
